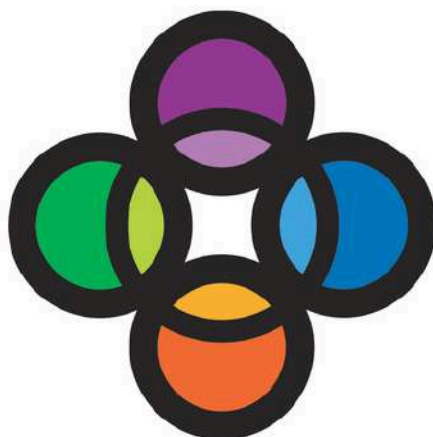

NCC CADETS - TRAINING

School Of India's NCC Cadets underwent Rifle Shooting exercises under the guidance of the 2nd Battalion, Bangalore. They first took part in the firing simulator exercise held at Rashtriya Military School, Bangalore. The hands-on firing training is an integral part of the NCC curriculum. It helps cadets build focus, discipline, precision, and confidence. The advanced firing simulator offers a secure environment, enabling them to sharpen their shooting skills without any risks associated. It was a valuable learning experience for our young cadets. Best cadets in Simulator firing exercise were Amrit - IXC, Eshaan - XE and Siddharth - XE.



Our cadets were then taken for a live bullet (0.22 rifle) firing session under the prestigious Parachute Regiment Commando training centre. This valuable session saw our cadets learning, picking up skills and techniques in a live, controlled environment under the expert training of the Parachute Regiment. For their first time handling ammunition, our cadets have done very well and the best cadets in firing (Shot grouping) were Ridhi, IXC - 6 cm, Amrit - IXC - 7cm and Shashank - XE - 7 cm.

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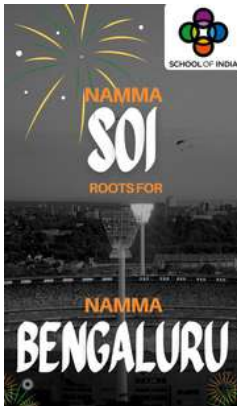

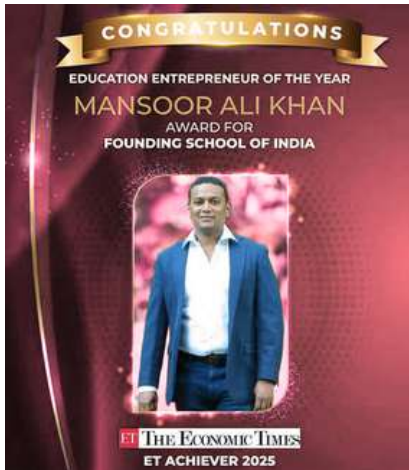

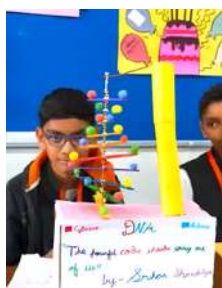
Class VI students presented working models on **nuclear reactors, infinity mirror, rocket science, constellations, and fun with magnets.**

Sritej Devarakonda | Class VIII | Changemaker Champion

Sritej an VIII Standard Student, chose “**Global Warming**” as the focus of his project for the 1m1b Changemakers World Cup. Staying below this threshold of 1.5°C is crucial for protecting our planet from the most devastating impacts of climate change. He discovered that studies show the Higher Income Group (HIG) contributes disproportionately to carbon emissions compared to the Middle and Lower Income Groups (MIG & LIC). However, India’s current income tax system primarily targets the MIG, covering only about 2% of the population, while large-scale consumption - and by extension, carbon emissions - remains largely unaccounted for.

His solution includes the out of the box solution of **Consumption-Based Carbon Tax** instead of the Income Tax system.

- Products with higher carbon footprints would carry higher taxes.
- This would discourage overconsumption of carbon-heavy goods.
- It ensures that those who emit more, pay more - creating a fairer, more climate-conscious tax system.



- At the same time, it would promote savings and sustainability, especially for LIC and MIG households.

This idea doesn’t just address climate change - it challenges the way we think about accountability, fairness, and our future !

Sritej’s previous solutions include a **Blood Demand and Supply Management** digital app as well as his campaign to raise **awareness about Cyber Security** amongst students and young social media users.

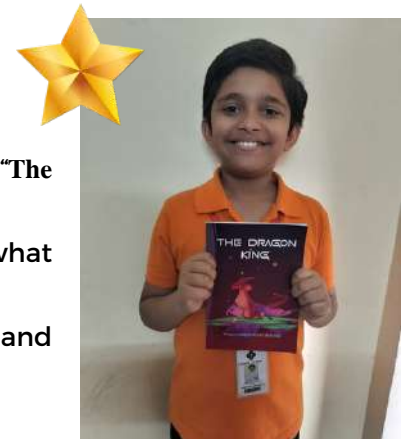

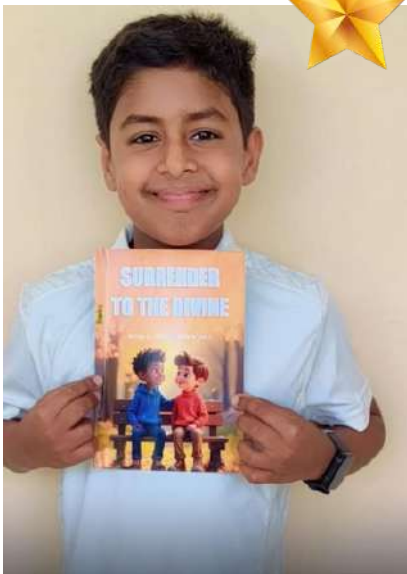
Her outstanding performance brought home a Gold in Team Kata, Silver in Kata and Bronze in Kumite.
